

Thank you so much for joining us on Easter! Below you will find the instructions for how to create Resurrection Eggs at home with common things you already have. What a great opportunity to take time as a family to celebrate Jesus this Easter.

### **Resurrection Eggs:**

- Egg 1: Small leaf/piece of grass- Jesus rode in on a donkey. The people waved palm branches (Matthew 21:1-11)
- Egg 2: Cotton ball with perfume on it- Mary poured expensive perfume on Jesus' feet (John 12:2-8).
- Egg 3: Small piece of bread/cracker- Jesus ate the last supper with His disciples (Matthew 26:17-19).
- Egg 4: Three dimes- Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver (Matthew 27:3).
- Egg 5: Toothpick or sticks to make a cross- Jesus carries His cross (John 19:7)
- Egg 6: Thorn or piece of a branch- Soldiers places a crown of thorns on Jesus' head (John 19:2).
- Egg 7: Dice- Soldiers parted Jesus' garments and cast lots for His coat (John 19:23).
- Egg 8: Nail- Jesus was nailed to a cross and pierced in His side (John 19:18, 37 & John 20:25-29).
- Egg 9: Q-tip-They gave Jesus sour wine mixed with gall on a sponge to drink (Matthew 27:34).
- Egg 10: Spices- Spices to prepare for Jesus for burial (John 19:40).
- Egg 11: small rock-The stone covering Jesus' tomb was rolled away (John 20:1)
- Egg 12: Nothing- The tomb is empty. He has risen! (John 20:1).

### **Instructions:**

1. Gather 12 eggs and number them 1-12. Place items above in each egg.
2. Go through the eggs starting at 1 with your children and read the scripture that goes with each egg to celebrate the Easter story.
