

**LifeGroup Study Sheet**

Nov 29th– Revelation of Jesus Christ – Part 10

This guide is designed to be helpful in preparing for your group discussion.

**Quick Review**

Look back from your sermon notes – Was there anything that particularly challenged you from this sermon? Anything you didn't understand, agree with or connect with?

**Introduction**

This passage is a beautiful depiction of Jesus' power, perfection and promise. But it also shows us of our own sinfulness and need for Jesus' perfection. The book of Isaiah gives a great foreshadowing of what happens in Revelation 5.

**Read Isaiah 29:11-14**

After reading this passage, why do you think nobody felt "worthy" enough to open the sealed scroll? How does what God says in this passage show you why humans are unable to open the seal? How does this show you your own sinfulness? What phrases or ideas uncover God's perfection and your own brokenness?

**Digging In****Read Revelation 5:1-14**

**Question 1:** The first 3 verses of this chapter talk about a scroll that is sealed. There is nobody in heaven or on earth that was worthy or able to open up the scroll and break the seals. What significance do you think there is that the scroll is in God's right hand? What does that signify?

**Read these passages:****Isaiah 41:10-13****Isaiah 48:13****Psalms 16:8****Psalms 110:1****Romans 8:34**

**Question 2:** The author of Revelation begins to weep because there is nobody found worthy to open the scroll. An elder around the throne then says something amazing – "Behold, the Lion of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and the seven seals." (**Rev 5:5**)

**Read Genesis 49:8-12 and Isaiah 1:1;10 – Romans 15:12**

Why is Jesus called the "Lion of Judah and the Root of David?" What do these titles tell about who He is?

**Question 3:** What circumstances in your life do you need to have reframed by looking at the lion who is also the slain lamb? In what areas of your life do you see as impossible for God to change? Why do you think you have that perspective? How can this passage help you change that?

**Question 4:** At the end of this passage, there are countless angels encircling the throne of God worshipping Jesus (**Rev 5:11**). How does the end of this passage encourage you to worship God in a different way? How does this passage change your perspective on how you worship Jesus? In what way can you create a spiritual disciple this week to help you engage in worship to God on a more consistent basis?

### Taking it Home

Take time this week to reflect of the specific worship that is involved in Revelation 5. Add some of these phrases to your prayer life this week. Share the impact of that perspective with someone as you worship God specifically through the lenses of Revelation 5 this week.

“Worthy is the Lamb who was slain”

“To receive power, wealth, wisdom and might, honor glory and blessing!”

“To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing, honor, glory, and might forever”
