<u>Feb 14th 2021– Revelation of Jesus Christ – Part 16</u> This guide is designed to help in preparing you for your group discussion.

Quick Review

Look back from your sermon notes – Was there anything that particularly challenged you from this sermon? Anything you didn't understand, agree with or connect with?

Introduction

Have you ever had to be a witness in a trial before? Describe what it was like explaining the events you saw. If not a witness, have you ever had to be on a jury for jury duty? Explain what it was like hearing the testimonies of the witnesses on the case.

Chapter 11 of Revelation talks about 2 Great Witnesses that will convey God's message to an unbelieving world.

Digging In

Read Revelation 11:1-14

<u>Question 1:</u> Revelation 11:3 says that God will grant power to the two witnesses during the Tribulation to give God's testimony to an unbelieving world. Read Daniel 9:27, and remind yourself what covenant the Jewish people have made with the antichrist during the Tribulation. How have you seen the world deceived already by Satan? How has your heart been deceived by the things of this world?

<u>Question 2:</u> Read Revelation 11:7. The beast (the antichrist) will eventually kill the Two Witnesses. But notice that the beast does not have the power to kill them until they have "completed their testimony." How does this show God's sovereignty? How do these two witnesses, even in the midst of the Tribulation show God's grace and mercy?

<u>Question 3:</u> Read Revelation 11:4-6. These Two Witnesses had incredible power from controlling when it rains to turning water into blood. All of these powers were to point to their testimony about God. How powerful do you think your testimony is today with Christ in you? What evidence of power do you own from your testimony in Jesus?

Read these passages to remind you of how the Holy Spirit works in the life of a Christian:

John 14:26 John 16:7-8 Acts 1:8 Corinthians 2:10-11 Ephesians 1:17-20

Question 4: After these Two Witnesses are killed, Revelation 11:11 says, "a breath of life from God entered them" and they were taken to heaven. How does what God does to these Two Witnesses make you think about what God has done for you in your own salvation? How has God breathed breath into your life? How is Jesus doing that even this week in your life?

Taking it Home

Even in the midst of the Tribulation, God is still wanting to get His testimony out to people who will perish in their unbelief. Reflect on the power that God gave these Two Witnesses in **Revelation 11**. Think of practical ways this week that you can use the power God has given you to be His Witness. Write them down and share them with your group next week.

Praise / Prayer Requests

Pray for your group with these things in mind:

<u>Adoration</u> – How can I praise God for what this teaches me?

Confession – What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

Thanksgiving – How can I thank God for what Jesus has done?

Supplication – What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
