Introduction

Revelation 15 and 16 is a description of God's unrelenting wrath that will be poured out against all injustice. This is possible because God is perfectly just.

What sort of things in our culture today is our world longing for justice in?

Digging In**Read Revelation 15 and 16**

Question 1: Read Revelation 15:2. How are you able to choose Godliness in the midst of godlessness? The Tribulation Saints were going against everything around them in an ungodly world. The Apostle Paul wrote about being Godly in an ungodly culture. **Read Titus 1:1**

How will you practice pursuing Godliness despite the culture and world around you?

Question 2: Read Revelation 16:9,11. Has your heart ever become resentful towards God in life? In what ways have you seen God show you the stubbornness of your own heart? The people in this passage were too stubborn to glorify God or repent from their sin.

Read 2 Peter 3:9 and Romans 2:3-5. How do these verses help you understand God's desire for repentance? What areas of your life is your heart still stubborn or unrepentant toward God?

Question 3: Read Revelation 16:5-7. In this judgement, God pours out His wrath and turns the fresh water of rivers and springs into blood. The angel then declares all of God's judgement, "just and true." Why do you think the angel can make the claim that God's judgement on earth is just and true? How does this shape your view of God's wrath?

Read Romans 1:18 -

Question 4: Read Revelation 16:17. God's wrath will finally be poured out with the seventh bowl, and then it will be done. This will conclude the end of the Tribulation. As pastor Jeff pointed out, this phrase is like what Jesus said when God's wrath was poured out on Him (**John 19:30**). The same wrath that God pours out in the

Tribulation (**Rev 16:19**), is described as a full cup that Jesus asks to be taken from Him before He is crucified (**Matt 26:39**).

Read Romans 5:8-10. How does this verse encourage you through what Jesus has done on your behalf? How does your perspective of God's wrath change when you read this?

Taking it Home

Read Revelation 16:15 and Matthew 24:42-44. Write down a few practical ways you will remain "ready, and clothed" this week.

Pray for your group with these things in mind:

Adoration – How can I praise God for what this teaches me?

Confession – What sin can I confess because of what this teaches me?

Thanksgiving – How can I thank God for what Jesus has done?

Supplication – What do I need to ask of God in order to grow in light of this?
