<u>June 13th 2021– Revelation of Jesus Christ – Part 29</u>
This guide is designed to help you in preparing for your group discussion.

### **Quick Review**

Look back from your sermon notes – Was there anything that particularly challenged you from this sermon? Anything you didn't understand, agree with or connect with?

#### Introduction

What battle scene from a movie or from history is most vivid to you? Why does that scene or event stick out to you? Who won? What was the purpose of that battle?

### Digging In

**Read Revelation 19:17-21 – The Battle of Armageddon.** Pastor Jeff talked about 4 different aspects of this battle that will take place – The Place (v.16), The Participants (v.19-20), The Prediction (v.17-18) and the Powerful Word (v.15, 21). Knowing all of these details of this battle, we ask ourselves the following questions to apply God's Word to our lives:

<u>Question 1:</u> Read Revelation 17:14. Which side of this battle will you be on? The Antichrist and his armies will make war against the Lamb. There are only two sides in this battle – one's against God, and those who are for Him – "called, faithful and chosen."

What does it look like in your life to know you have been chosen and called by God?

Read John 15:16, Ephesians 1:3-4, 2 Thessalonians 2:14

<u>Question 2:</u> Read Romans 8:28-31. What battle are you currently fighting? It is easy to dismiss this question and think of someone else's battle – what is God allowing you specifically to go through that you are fighting? With your thoughts, with your eyes, with your actions? If you are a Christian, why does God allow us to go through battles? What is the ultimate purpose?

God reminds us in **Revelation 19** that one day – He will end all battles.

<u>Question 3:</u> Read 2 Corinthians 10:3-5. How are you currently fighting in the battle you are in? Are you "waging war according to the flesh?" How do you remind yourself that your battle is NOT against flesh and blood? (Ephesians 6:12).

Read Colossians 2:15 and Ephesians 1:19-21

What do both of these passages remind you of? How will it change how you will fight your battles this week?

<u>Question 4</u>: Read Hebrews 4:12. Is the Word of God living and active in your life right now? How is the Word of God examining your life right now? Revelation 19:15; 21 are important reminders as to how powerful God's word is – He will end the ultimate battle will the "sword" of his mouth – His word.

How does viewing God's word in this manner change the priority it has in your life?

## **Taking it Home**

God will ultimately fight and win the Battle of Armageddon. Christians know how the story will end. What ways are you going to remind yourself this week of these truths as your fight the battle that you are currently in?
